San Diego restaurant owners were dealt a serious blow last week when a new COVID-19 health order shut down all <u>on-site dining. To</u> raise money for the thousands of employees laid off just before Christmas, several restaurateurs have launched fundraising specials and meal donation programs. Here are several: Group, which runs the Breakfast Republic chain and five other local restaurant concepts, is donating free prepared take-away meals to laid-off workers from any industry impacted by the shutdown. This is the second time this year company founder Johan Engman has offered the program, which last spring gave away nearly 6,500 meals valued at more than \$52,000 over a
